JANUARY

THE JANUARY CHALLENGE

Each year, thousands of people take part in 64 Million Artists' 31 days of free creative challenges. The January Challenge takes place across social media and promotes creativity, peer support and wellbeing. In 2020 they will focus on creative wellbeing in the workplace and are offering all sorts of different organisations their own bespoke experience. This is a great way to start your year at work or otherwise.

FEBRUARY

LGBT HISTORY MONTH

Promoting equality and diversity for the benefit of the public. Increasing the visibility of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender ("LGBT") people, their history, lives and their experiences in the curriculum and culture of educational and other institutions, and the wider community. MARCH

BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK

The British Science Association runs <u>British Science Week</u> every March, and welcomes involvement from anyone interested in science and local events. As a Fun Palace Maker, you might want to link with a local BSA branch, join in with their events and invite them to contribute to yours. This year's dates are 6-15 March.

MAY

AGE OF CREATIVITY FESTIVAL

The Age of Creativity supports professionals in arts, health, culture, social care, academia, voluntary and community sectors to enable more older people to take part creative activities and enjoy improved health, wellbeing and quality of life. Community Business Weekend celebrates 7000+ community businesses in local hands across England. In 2018, 225 community businesses opened their doors and used the long weekend to demonstrate the positive impact they have on society and

SEPTEMBER

HERITAGE OPEN DAYS

SILVER SUNDAY

Silver Sunday provides an opportunity for local authorities, charities, community groups and private, voluntary and public organisations to promote what they already do to relieve social isolation and loneliness among older people. Black History Month takes place throughout October and is an opportunity to remember the past and look to the future, joining together to renew our commitment to racial equality. RE-ENGAGE

Re-Engage brings older people together in social groups at a time in their lives when their social circles are diminishing. Last year, nearly 7,000 older guests were part of over 900 groups across the UK, supported by 12,000 volunteers. WHAT NEXT?

What Next? is a UK-wide movement bringing people together to articulate, champion and strengthen the role of culture in our society. There are local chapters across the UK, bringing together those working in or passionate about culture, to address issues of relevance to them. WN?
