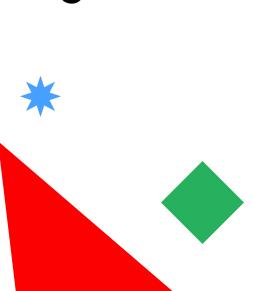

78% of Lead Makers agreed that their Fun Palace opened up new partnerships, opportunities or resources

72% of Lead Makers said that they learned new skills as a result of running a Fun Palace

47% of Makers had at least one person join their Maker team, who had previously been a participant at their Fun Palace - a total of just under 300 people in 2024!
